

The Reading Group will meet at the library on Wednesday, August 17, 2022, at 4 p.m. to discuss **The Awakening** by Kate Chopin. When first published in 1899, *The Awakening* shocked readers with its honest treatment of female marital infidelity. Audiences accustomed to the pieties of late Victorian romantic fiction were taken aback by Chopin's daring portrayal of a woman trapped in a stifling marriage, who seeks and finds passionate physical love outside the confines of her domestic situation. Aside from its unusually frank treatment of a then-controversial subject, the novel is widely admired today for its literary qualities. Although the theme of marital infidelity no longer shocks, few novels have plumbed the psychology of a woman involved in an illicit relationship with the perception, artistry, and honesty that Kate Chopin brought to *The Awakening*.

Copies of the books are available in the library. You are welcome to join us for an interesting discussion.

this from Amanda, one of our neighbors With so many wonderful things from the garden this time of year, how about something Blueberry!

Lemon pecan Blueberry Bars

1 cup butter softened

³/₄ cup powdered sugar

2 cups all-purpose flour

¹/₂ cup finely chopped pecans, save out 1 tbsp

1 ¹/₂ cup Blueberries (thaw if using frozen)

4 eggs

1 ¹/₂ cup granulated sugar

¹/₂ cup lemon juice (fresh squeezed is best)

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1 tsp. baking powder

Pre heat the oven to 350°

Mix the vanilla and baking powder with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of flour and set aside.

Beat the butter until fluffy. Beat in the powdered sugar. Gradually beat the 2 cups of flour. Stir in the pecans. Press this mixture onto the bottom of a lightly greased 13x9 pan. Bake until golden, about 20 minutes. Remove from oven and top evenly with the blueberries.

Mix eggs, granulated sugar, lemon juice, and the vanilla and baking powder mixture. Beat on medium speed for 2 minutes. Pour mixture over the blueberries. Sprinkle with remaining pecans. Bake until set and topping is lightly browned, about 30-35 minutes. Remove from oven and cool in the pan, dust with powdered sugar if desired. Store in the refrigerator.

EARLY VOTING FOR THE STATE PRIMARY

Most everyone who requested an early ballot by using the postcard sent by the Secretary of State should have already received their Primary ballot, but there is still time to vote early. You can:

- Call the Town Clerk at 537-2611 and ask to have ballots sent to you.
- Pick up your own ballot at the Town Office.
- Vote at the Town Office up until 3pm on Monday, August 8th. Mon-Tues-Thurs-Fri from 9am to 3pm and Wednesday 3-7pm.

HOW TO RETURN YOUR EARLY BALLOT

- First, make sure you've filled out the certification envelope and sealed your voted ballot inside. For the Primary, each voter is mailed ballots for all three parties but you are only allowed to vote one ballot. The two ballots you don't use **must** also be returned in the "Unvoted Ballots" envelope.
- You or anyone of your choosing can hand-deliver your voted ballot to the Town Office. There is now a secure drop box at the southwest corner of the building where ballots can be returned even if the office is not open. We'll be checking it daily, and several times during the day on Election Day. Ballots can also be returned directly to the Community Hall polling place from 10AM to 7PM on August 9th.
- Your ballot can be returned by mail in the envelope provided. If you choose this option, please allow plenty of time for delivery. IN ORDER TO BE COUNTED YOUR BALLOT MUST BE RECEIVED (NOT JUST POSTMARKED) BY 7PM ON AUGUST 9TH. As soon as the polls close, teams of election officials tally the votes on the Primary ballots and the results are then immediately sent to the Secretary of State.

The municipal rate was calculated and set by the Selectboard on July 11, 2022 and raises the funds to cover the amounts voted at Town Meeting for the general expenses of the town, the Highway budget, and all appropriations such as those for the Library and the maintenance of the cemeteries. This rate is the same for both Homestead and Non-Homestead properties.

The local agreement rate compensates the state education fund for the \$20,000 reduction in assessment (not taxes) that Benson has voted to give its disabled veterans. This is also the same for all properties.

Education rates are set by the State, taking into account local per pupil spending plus their analysis of how close to fair market value our Grand List is (Benson's common level of appraisal). A property which the owner has declared to be their principle residence with the Vermont Department of Taxes pays the Homestead rate. All other properties pay the Non-Homestead Rate.

*A tax rate is the amount of property tax owed per \$100 of property valuation. At this year's rates, a property assessed at \$100,000 would owe \$2,116.70 at the homestead rate and \$2,311.00 at the non-homestead rate.

TAX BILLS WILL BE MAILED BY THE FIRST WEEK IN AUGUST AND THE FIRST PAYMENT WILL BE DUE SEPTEMBER 15th.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING A JUSTICE OF THE PEACE?

In addition to voting on state and national offices, Benson will also choose its five Justices of the Peace at the General Election in November. Most people probably think of JPs in terms of their authority to perform marriages, but the office is actually one of the oldest in Vermont and involves other very important responsibilities. Benson's Justices are election officials for the town and serve on the Boards that determine tax appeals and hear requests for abatements. The number of justices in a given town is determined on the basis of population, and all towns elect their justices every two years as a part of the General Election. Anyone interested in serving in this important position should pick up a petition to get on the ballot at the Town Office or by visiting sos.vermont.gov/elections. **Petitions and consent forms from independent candidates must be filed with the Town Clerk by 5:00 pm on Friday, August 12th.**

Town Garage Update

We signed the Master Agreement with ClearSpan for the purchase of the town garage and a separate Master Agreement for the erection of the building. We are waiting to receive blue prints from ClearSpan in order to put other components of the building out to bid. We hope to have the blue prints very soon.

Selectboard Update

The Selectboard hired Carrie Lafond as the new Selectboard assistant. Carrie began work on June 30. Email Carrie at <u>Bensonselectboardasst@gmail.com</u> with any questions or correspondence.

The Board voted to use the asphalt millings from the RT 22A repaying project on Sunset Lake Rd beginning at the Orwell town line and down along Sunset Lake. *This decision was made after consulting with the State to confirm that the asphalt millings did not pose a risk to the lake's water quality.*

We voted to allow First Light Technology to bury fiber optic cable under State Rd, for a distance of 1.7 miles from the location of the cell phone tower. This will allow First Light to complete the installation on a cell tower in Orwell, improving cell phone service along RT 22A.

Dog registration. Letters are being sent to dog owners who registered their dos in 2021 but have not registered them in 2023. We hope that all owners of unregistered dogs comply with State Law and register their dogs.

We contracted with Pike Industries to pave portions of Lake Street. Paving should begin before the end of July.

We sent out a Request for Proposals for trucking gravel to roads and trucking winter sand. This is a four month contract, rather than a 12 month contract we've used previously. The Board felt that fuel prices might come down in the next three months and that it would be more cost effective to not ask truckers to estimate out for a year given unknown fuel prices.

We've selected Hubbard as the new vendor to pick up compost material at the transfer station.

We are continuing to try to find a way to get the burned out structure on Stage Road cleaned up.

NOTICE TO VOTERS

A statewide primary election will be held on Tuesday, August 09, 2022 to select Republican, Democratic, and Progressive Party candidates for the following offices:

U.S. Representative Governor Lieutenant Governor Attorney General State's Attorney State Treasurer Secretary of State Auditor of Accounts U.S Senator Sheriff State Senator(s) State Representative High Bailiff Probate Judge Assistant Judge

The Secretary of State's election office will be sending all registered voters a postcard how to request a ballot. If you don't get a postcard, it means that there is probably a problem with your voter registration information in the Statewide Checklist system (most likely a mistake in your mailing address). It's important to get this corrected now because the State will be using those addresses to mail ballots to everyone for the General Election in November. If you chose to vote by mail for the Primary, here's a couple things to keep in mind:

- Each voter is mailed ballots for all three parties but you are only allowed to vote one ballot. The two ballots you don't use must be returned in the "Unvoted Ballots" envelope or your vote can't be counted.
- Ballots must be received (not just postmarked) by the close of the polls at 7pm on August 9th. You can return your ballot by mail or drop it in the secure drop box you'll see at the corner of the Town Office building. We'll be checking it daily, and several times during the day on Election Day.

In addition to asking for a ballot to be mailed to you, you can cast your vote by:

- Voting at the Town Office <u>up until 3pm on Monday, August 8th</u>. The office is open Mon-Tues-Thurs-Fri from 9am to 3pm and Wednesday 3-7pm, and there is a handicapped entrance at the rear.
- Voting in person at the Benson Community Hall on August 9th. Polls will be open 10am-7pm.
