BENSON VILLAGE SCHOOL - Go BEARS!

We welcome December and celebrate 63 days of hard work, fun, and PAWsitive relationships that are at the heart of our school community. BVS has welcomed 16 new students to our school this year and many have joined our afterschool Boys & Girls Club bringing the total number of participants to 26 students . The BVS Daisy and Girl Scout Troops have been busy with activities and the girls have already earned several badges! Our American Sign Language and Beading/Crafting Clubs begin this month and will carry through early February.

Students have moved into their routines and are demonstrating their academic growth through a variety of measures. The Bridges II math program and Number Corner components allow for both unit check-ups and quarterly assessment on the grade level content. STAR 360 is a progress monitoring assessment for both reading and math that allows teachers to adjust their instruction for each student. Lexia is a reading support, added this year, that enhances each student's progress as it is individualized to their specific reading level. Mrs. Amanda Eddy, BVS Special Educator/Interventionist/Lead Teacher, and I meet weekly to review student data to ensure that both teachers and students have what they need to meet academic goals. Each teacher conferences with Mrs. Eddy during the week for a 45 minute Data Team PLC (Professional Learning Community). Our schoolwide goal is to provide each student with the most appropriate instruction based on their needs.

Project-based learning has been on full display at BVS as seen with the Tin Can Racer STEAM Week that concluded just before Thanksgiving. Our doors were opened for parent volunteers during a 3-day build process and the race day that followed. Over 20 parents/grandparents came in to support students as they designed, built and tested a variety of spool and tin can racers. Mrs. Jessica Thurston has taken the lead on orchestrating these events and has 2 more planned for this year.

Our Prek program has been running with 2 groups this year. Nine 3 year olds and eight 4 year olds attend separately 2 days a week from 7:45 - 12:45. Mrs. Laura Dailey, Mrs. Cris Andronaco and Ms. Chelsey Stack have created a fabulous program for these youngest Benson Bears and the laughter and joy that exude from these students is contagious!

Benson Village School continues to award both students and staff with PAWs certificates for demonstrating the positive character traits associated with our districtwide PBIS (<u>https://www.pbis.org/</u>). To date, 198 certificates have been written for students and staff.

The SVUVT budget work is well under way and a reminder that there is one budget for the entire district, not individual school budgets. The SVUVT Finance meetings and the SVUVT Regular Board meetings are the place to be for listening and participating during the budget season. *Your voice does matter* and we hope you will attend either in person, by phone or through the google meet link provided on the agendas that can be found here: <u>https://www.slatevalleyunified.org/documents/school-board/agendas/60979</u>

Selectboard Highlights

Use Caution when driving on roads this winter.

The Selectboard has been notified that we may not be able to get an adequate amount of road salt this winter. There are three factors:

- 1. There is a shortage of salt
- 2. Railroad workers may strike delaying shipments of salt to Vermont
- 3. There is a shortage of truck drivers to deliver salt from rail terminals.

We may have to use a blend of salt and sand on the roads, rather than straight salt. This will increase the amount of time it takes for the salt in the mix to clear the roads.

Please drive carefully and slow down when the roads are slippery.

And a few winter reminders...

Parking Ban: The Town of Benson's Traffic Ordinance states: no person owning, operating, or controlling a motor vehicle shall park, or cause to be parked, said motor vehicle on the traveled portion of any street or highway within the Town of Benson from November 15th through April 15th inclusive. Any such motor vehicle may be removed at the owner's expense. Sand Pile: The Town maintains a small clearly marked stockpile of sand at the Highway Garage for the personal (not commercial) use of the residents. Citizens may manually load sand from this designated pile into their personal vehicle. For your safety, please be aware of Town trucks entering or leaving, and remember that THE MAIN SAND PILE AND THE SALT PILE ARE STRICTLY OFF LIMITS TO THE PUBLIC.

<u>Plowing</u>: State law prohibits plowing or blowing snow into or across Town or State highways, shoulders or sidewalks. Although this is hard to avoid, material should not be left such that it creates an obstruction or mound.

It's Time for Holiday Recipes

These are from Meghan, one of our neighbors

Old Hungarian Stamped Cookies

I got this recipe when I was travelling in Hungary. An elderly woman at a market was selling wooden cookie stamps with designs embossed on them and gave me the recipe when I bought a stamp. While a cookie stamp makes these beautiful, you could use virtually anything to texture the cookie and make it visually appealing, or just eat the cookie in its original form. This recipe specifies that you could choose to add fresh 1 tablespoon lemon juice and grated lemon peel, a tablespoon of honey, 1/3 cup of cocoa, honey, grated almond, or grated coconut. Another variation I've seen is to make an indent and fill these cookies with jam.

Ingredients:

3 ½ cups flour
1 cup confectioners sugar
1 ¼ stick of softened butter
1/3 cup shortening
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
2 eggs

Directions:

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 350 degrees
- Mix the ingredients until they are well combined and the dough can be easily rolled out to a thickness of ¼ inch.
- 3. Cut out the cookies with a cookie cutter, then stamp them to give them a pattern.
- 4. Place cookies on a baking sheet and bake them for 8-10 minutes. This time might vary depending on your oven, so watch them closely.

Mulled Wine

This alcoholic drink is a staple across much of Europe during the winter. It's served at winter outdoor events and is a great way to warm up after a day outside in the snow.

Ingredients:

- 1 bottle of a medium-bodied red wine (I use Pinot Noir)
- 3/4 cup water
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 1 orange
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 1-2 star anise
- 8-10 whole cloves

Directions:

- 1. In a medium saucepan, combine the water, sugar, and spices. Bring to a boil while stirring constantly, then reduce heat and continue to simmer.
- 2. Cut the orange into round slices and place them into the mixture, then cook until it thickens slightly like syrup.
- 3. Pour in the wine and stir, heating gradually until steaming. Do not boil!
- 4. Once it is steaming, use a ladle to pour it into mugs. You can choose to serve the floating spices and oranges or not.
