#### BENSON VILLAGE SCHOOL - Go BEARS!

After a beautiful start to fall, we watch as those last few leaves cling to the trees and the days get shorter. The students have been in school for 41 days at the start of this month and have enjoyed so many new experiences both in and outside of the classrooms! Girl Scouts is in full swing with both a Brownie and Girl Scout group meeting every Tuesday at BVS. Our 1st & 2nd Soccer Clinic was a tremendous success and we look forward to another partnership with parent volunteers in the spring. The K - 6 students enjoyed 8 weeks of yoga with Petra O'Neill from Petra's Wellness Studio and they continue monthly outings with Sandra Owens and her Funology.

Academic areas have been assessed and data is being continually analyzed for both classroom instructional needs and intervention groupings. STAR 360, Lexia and Bridges Number Corner allow teachers to monitor student understanding, growth and proficiency in the areas of reading and mathematics. BVS is so proud of our students in the specific area of mathematics as there was not 1 student K - 6 who displayed any regression from the spring of 22' to this fall based on the STAR 360 assessment. This speaks volumes about the incredible instruction the teachers deliver and how engaged and supported the students feel.

The K - 6 students have enjoyed their first whole school PBIS Celebration (<a href="https://www.pbisvermont.org/">https://www.pbisvermont.org/</a>) after filling the school hive with buzz beads awarded for positive behavior to individual students and classrooms. Decorating cupcakes was the chosen activity! Individual classroom celebrations included extra recess and bring your favorite stuffed animal in movie afternoons.

Our October Student Count holds strong at 70 students with the biggest class of Kindergarteners (14 students) in over 10 years.

Benson's Thanksgiving Family Dinner will welcome families back into the building on Tuesday, November 22nd this year. The school holiday vacation begins on the 23rd.



# **NEW!** Culinary Corner

#### Apple Cake

1 cup sugar

1 egg

1 tbsp butter

½ c applesauce

1 ½ c flour

1 tsp baking soda

3/4 tsp cinnamon

½ tsp salt

2 c peeled and chopped apples

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease or otherwise prepare an 8x8 square pan. In a large mixing bowl combine sugar, egg, butter and applesauce and mix on high speed for 2 minutes. fold in the flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt. Mix just until smooth. Mix apples in gently. Pour into prepared pan and top with a mixture of 2 tbsp of sugar and ½ tsp of cinnamon. Bake for 45-55 minutes. Cool in the pan on a wire rack. *Hint*, this is fabulous served warm topped with ice cream or whipped cream!

## **Voting by ABSENTEE BALLOT**

It is too late to return your ballot by mail but there are other options if you don't want to stand in line at the polling place on November 8th:

- First, make sure you've filled out the certification envelope and sealed your voted ballot inside.
- You or anyone of your choosing can hand-deliver your voted ballot to the Town Office. There is also a secure drop box at the southwest corner of the building where ballots can be returned even if the office is not open. We'll be checking it daily, and several times during the day on Election Day until 7pm.
- Ballots can also be returned directly to the Community Hall polling place from 10AM to 7PM on November 8<sup>th</sup>.

# VOTING IN PERSON ON ELECTION DAY POLLS OPEN at the COMMMUNITY HALL 10AM TO 7PM

All registered voters should have received a ballot in the mail, please bring your ballot with you to the polls to fill out in the voting booth. For voters who were issued a ballot but don't have it with them, ballots will be available but you will be asked to complete the following affidavit before voting.

## **Selectboard Highlights**

- Special Town Meeting was held October 20, 200 at 7:00pm at the Community Hall Regarding Traffic and Parking Ordinance. The revisions to the Ordinance approved by the Selectboard in July 2022 were voted down by a vote of 35 to 12. *The ordinance passed in 2014 remains in effect.*
- Mill Pond Road project has been completed, with a little under a mile of road being ditched and bad culverts replace. 80% of the cost this project was funded by a grant.
- Brad Barret has been hired as the Town Road Foreman
- Town Garage project has been postponed until Spring
- Plans are in the works to get the cell phone tower on Stage Road wired and so that the repeater the Town has purchased can be installed and used. When the new equipment is installed, members of the Fire Department will receive notification for calls through the Cell tower on Stage Road, improving signal quality.
- Big Thank you to The Towns of Orwell and West Haven for the use of their equipment
- Grading and Ditching continue all over town
- Winter Sand has been hauled in and the sand pile covered.
- A contract for winter salt has been signed.
