NEW! Culinary Corner

this from Jon E, one of our neighbors

Pear Tarte Tatin Recipe

Ingredients:

-9 inch cast iron skillet
-pie crust
-4 large Anjou pears
-dash of fresh grated nutmeg
-dash of ground ginger
-seeds from one half of a vanilla pod
-pinch of salt
-4 tbsp pear brandy
-4 tbsp butter (unsalted)

- -4 tosp butter (unsalted -1/2 cup white sugar
- -1/2 cup white sugar -1/2 cup mascarpone cheese
- -1 tsp maple syrup

Instructions:

-roll out the pie crust from your favorite pie crust recipe, and set it aside (make sure you can retrieve it easily and quickly because you'll have to put it on top of a hot cast iron skillet) -Preheat oven to 375

-peel pears being careful not to take off too much meat -core and slice the pears vertically (they'll be used to make a pinwheel design)

-place pear slices in a mixing bowl, add nutmeg, ginger, vanilla, and 2 tbsp of brandy, then toss to allow seasoning and alcohol to coat the pears

-melt butter in cast iron skillet on low heat

-once melted and before it foams or browns, add sugar and remaining 2 tbsp of brandy, and mix until sugar melts into butter -place pear slices into skillet with round part of pear on the bottom (touching skillet) and the tip of the pear pointing toward the center of the skillet; form a pinwheel shape in the skillet -turn heat up to medium to allow the liquid mixture and pears to caramelize, and the pears to become slightly tender (about 10-15 minutes)

-place pie crust on top of skillet, and use spoon to push or fold the crust under the pears near the edge of the skillet

-place pie in oven and bake for 25-30 minutes or until the crust looks done

-remove from oven and allow to cool completely

-mix mascarpone with maple syrup

-place serving dish on top of skillet, and flip to allow the crust to be on the bottom and the pear to be on the top

-add large dollop of mascarpone to the center of the pie where there are no pears, and set some aside for additional garnish or topping if desired on top of or next to individually sliced pie pieces


Attention 4-H er's Past and Present



HOW WE VOTED: The State Primary

Of Benson's 798 registered voters, 163 voted in the State Primary on August 9th: 95 in person and 57 using the absentee process. There were 87 Democratic ballots, 74 Republican ballots, and no Progressive ballot cast. WHAT'S NEXT?

Ballots for the General Election in November will be mailed to all active registered voters directly from the State beginning around September 21st. Look for details about options for returning your ballot in the October Benson Bulletin. The polls will also be open from 10 am to 7 pm on Election Day if you choose to vote in person. In addition to voting on State and National offices, Benson will also choose its five Justices of the Peace on November 8th. Candidates are Lynn Bowen, John Hill, Tom Neumann, Ed Peltier and Eric Shaw (all incumbents). All are running as Independents. Benson's Justices are election officials for the town and serve on the boards that rule on tax appeals and hear requests for abatements. The number of justices in a given town is determined on the basis of population, and all towns elect their justices every two years as a part of the General Election.

PROPERTY TAXES DUE SEPTEMBER 15th

The first installment of 2022-2023 property taxes is due on Tuesday, September 15th.

There is no grace period. In order to count as timely (and avoid interest charges) payments must be delivered in person to the Town Office by the close of business on the due date (5pm) or carry a legible USPS postmark of September 15th or earlier. If you handle your by bill paying electronically you should be aware that the envelopes used generally do not carry a postmark. They cannot be considered on time—regardless of the date on the check — unless they arrive at the Town Office on or before the due date. If you'd like a receipt, please include a SASE with your payment, or you're welcome to call the Office at 802-537-2611 to make sure your payment arrived safely.


Regular Town Office hours are:
