Kathleen Harriman was a champion skier, war correspondent, and daughter of US ambassador to the Soviet Union Averell Harriman. Sarah Churchill, an actress-turned-RAF officer, was devoted to her brilliant father, who depended on her astute political mind. Roosevelt's only daughter, Anna, chosen instead of her mother Eleanor to accompany the president to Yalta, arrived there as keeper of her father's most damaging secrets.


From the Road Commissioner





Asparagus Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 onion
- 1 clove of garlic
- 1 stick of butter, separated
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1 bundle of asparagus spears (around 15 spears)
- 3 tablespoons dry white wine
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- ½ teaspoon Paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon Nutmeg
- Salt and pepper to taste
- ½ cup heavy cream
- 2 cups cheddar cheese
- Cooked bacon (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Peel and dice your onion and garlic into small pieces and cook in a large pot with two tablespoons of butter until your onions are translucent.
- 2. Add the rest of your butter and let it melt before adding in the flour and stirring until it forms a thickened paste.
- 3. Chop your asparagus into ¼ inch pieces, then place it into the pot with your onions and butter mixture. Cook on low for about five minutes with the lid on your pot.
- 4. Add your white wine and your broth and stir, then season with paprika, nutmeg, salt, and pepper. Mix well.
- 5. Bring your mixture to a boil, then reduce the heat and mix in your heavy cream. Then allow to a simmer for 20 minutes.
- 6. Reduce the heat to low and add cheese gradually, stirring to allow it to melt evenly.
- 7. Serve warm and top with cooked bacon crumbles if desired.

EASY HOMEMADE PLAYDOUGH

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup all-purpose <u>flour</u>
- 1 cup water
- 2 teaspoons <u>cream of tartar</u>
- 1/3 cup <u>salt</u>
- 1 tablespoon <u>vegetable oil</u>
- food coloring

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Mix together all the ingredients in a 2-quart saucepan.
- 2. Cook over low/medium heat, stirring.
- 3. Continue stirring until the mixture is thickened and begins to gather around the spoon.
- 4. Remove the dough onto wax paper or a plate to cool.

Makes the equivalent of 3 containers. Cool completely before storing in a zip lock bag or sealed container.

And, while not recommended, it is completely edible!

We hope to use Facebook, in conjunction with our website, to get timely information out to the people of Benson, including weather-related info, emergency management, and public events.

As we have limited resources to monitor social media (both from a staff perspective and the fact that our internet signal stinks), we plan to start out small. Our Town Clerk and Road Crew Foreman will have access to be able to make posts and we hope to do more as we go along.

Rt 22A Update

Cheryl Murray met with Bruce Martin of AOT (Roadway Design Project Manager) and two design engineers who are consulting with him on the Route 22A project. They have been working on some changes to the plan for the Benson segment, based on the feedback they received at the 502 hearing in June.

They reported that they have also met with the Agency of Natural Resources to map wetlands and coordinate any issues, in order to integrate that into the plan.

The new design includes changes to the intersection of Lake Rd and Rt 22A. They are currently looking at a left turning lane, a straight through lane, and a right turning lane, heading both north and south for this intersection. In addition, they are changing the layout of the intersection to bring Mill Pond Rd a little farther north, so that it aligns more directly across from Lake Rd, instead of the angle it is currently at. I told them I thought this would be well received news for both sides of town.

Based on feedback and a closer inspection of the G&L Store regarding gas pumps, parking issues, and the setback requirements, they have designed a larger curb on the corner of Route 144 and also moved the traveled roadway more towards the west. The additional space that would be provided by shifting the roadway and adding more pavement would provide much better mobility and more opportunity for turning movements for all vehicles. In addition, there would be a one-way entrance to the G&L from Route 144, instead of the way it is now (with cars able to enter and exit from all directions).

The current plan with these changes has now been sent out to review for 3 weeks for others around the Agency to comment on, regarding permitting aspects, constructability, etc. that may need some revising prior to meeting with property owners. Once the design is finalized, they will update the website with the new drawings, and then the next step is to begin property owner meetings in February/March.
