#### For Reading Group meeting on May 31, 2023

The Reading Group will meet at the library on Wednesday, May 31, 2023 to discuss <u>Black Cake</u> by Charmaine Wilkerson. In present-day California, Eleanor Bennett's death leaves behind a puzzling inheritance for her two children, Byron and Benny: a black cake, made from a family recipe with a long history, and a voice recording. In her message, Eleanor shares a tumultuous story about a headstrong young swimmer who escapes her island home under suspicion of murder. The heartbreaking tale Eleanor unfolds, the secrets she still holds back, and the mystery of a long-lost child challenge everything the siblings thought they knew about their lineage and themselves. This debut novel is a story of how the inheritance of betrayals, secrets, memories, and even names can shape relationships and history.

#### For Reading Group meeting on June 21, 2023

The Reading Group will meet at the library on Wednesday, June 21, 2023 to discuss <u>Educated</u> by Tara Westover. In this memoir, Tara tells the story of the events of her life from a vantage point in her late twenties, occasionally interjecting to comment on the process of trying to arrive at an accurate version of the past. Tara was born the youngest of seven children to parents whom she refers to as Faye and Gene (pseudonyms). The Westover family lived on a farm in rural Idaho, where Gene made a living salvaging scrap metal while Faye worked as an unlicensed midwife and herbal healer. Gene suffered from paranoid fears about interference from the federal government, and as a result he refused to allow his children to attend school, receive birth certificates, or receive medical attention. Gene was also a devout Mormon who believed in radical self-sufficiency and an impending Day of Judgement.



#### SPECIAL TOWN MEETING ON MAY 27, 2023

At the Town Meeting in March, Benson voters chose to reduce the annual General Fund Budget to zero, and to also reduce the Town Highway Budget to zero. Therefore both budgets failed and the (mostly) new select board was tasked with presenting new budgets to the taxpayers at a Special Meeting. That meeting date has now been set as noted below in the warning. The select board and Town Clerk have included here also a Budget Summary, outlining the budget they will be presenting on May 27th to the voters.

The select board has spent a lot of time researching and speaking to each department in order to come up with a budget that they feel is realistic and within the town's means to implement.

Please if you can, make it a priority to attend this meeting. You will see there is also an article (#3) that is asking if the town should transition to voting these two annual budgets by Australian Ballot instead of voting on them at Town Meeting on the floor. This is at the request of many voters who feel because they can't attend town meeting on a Tuesday morning, that their voices are not heard on the two major pieces of town spending allotments.

#### WARNING MAY 27, 2023 FOR THE BENSON SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

The legal voters of the Town of Benson in the County of Rutland and the State of Vermont are hereby warned and notified to meet at the Community Hall in said Town on the 27th of May, 2023, at 10 a.m. to transact the following business:

Article 1: Shall the Town vote to approve the expenditure of \$433,690 for the General Fund Budget

of which \$278,303 shall be raised by taxes?

Article 2: Shall the Town vote to approve the expenditure of \$799,270 for the layout, repair and

maintenance of Town Highways of which \$538,944 shall be raised by taxes?

Article 3: Shall the Town of Benson adopt its General Fund Budget Article and Town Highway

Budget Article by Australian ballot pursuant to 17 V.S.A. § 2680(c)?

Article 4: To transact any other business proper to be done at the Special Town Meeting.

# **TOWN OFFICE NOTES**

- Are you the owner of one of Benson's nearly 300 dogs? **Dog tags for 2023 are blue this year.** All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed on or before April 1<sup>st</sup>. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required for registration, after April costs are \$11.00 for spayed or neutered animals and \$17.00 for all others. If you no longer own the dog, please let us know (537-2611).
- ➤ Your current **transfer station permit** expired on March 31<sup>st</sup>. New permits are now available and may be purchased from the Town Office for \$35.00 (no increase from last year). Both dog licenses and transfer station permits can be handled by mail and/or using the secure drop box. Just give me a call for the details.
- ➤ **SEWER BILLS DUE June 15<sup>th</sup>:** The second payment on Benson 2022-2023 sewer bill is due on Thursday June 15<sup>th</sup>. There is no grace period all payments not made in person at the Town Office or postmarked by that date incur a one-time 8% penalty and immediately begin accruing interest charges at the rate of 1% for the first three months and 1½% per month thereafter. That is, if the payment due on June 15<sup>th</sup> is not made until June 16<sup>th</sup> you will owe an additional 9% interest and penalty.
- ➤ **Reminder:** There is a secure drop box located at the southwest corner of the Town Office building where sewer payments may be left at any time.
- ➤ Join us Saturday May 27<sup>th</sup> at 10 AM for a Special Town Meeting (details elsewhere in Bulletin).
- ➤ Sunday May 28<sup>th</sup> there will be a brief ceremony at 11:15 a.m. to honor Memorial Day at the Town Office. All are welcome to attend.
- ➤ The Town Office will be closed on Monday, May 29th in observance of the Federal holiday.
- ➤ The Town Office will be closed on Monday, June 19th in observance of the Federal holiday.

Can you believe that 40 years ago, Fair Haven



Acting primarily as an emergency food pantry, helping people access support in housing needs, fresh water, and in heating their homes.

Another essential support being offered is helping people navigate the various barriers to receiving state and federal help. FHC has helped many families be able to get the support that they need to feed their families. Having a friendly person offer that support is important.
