
THANK YOU for reading the Benson Bulletin. Please support our advertisers as best you can!

## **BENSON VILLAGE SCHOOL - GO BEARS!**



We welcome November & December and celebrate so many days of hard work, fun, and **PAW**sitive relationships that are at the heart of our school community. BVS has welcomed many new students to our school this year and many have joined our afterschool Boys & Girls Club and the BVS Daisy and Girl Scout Troop. Beading/Crafting Club began in October and carries into December.

Students have moved into their routines and are demonstrating their academic growth through a variety of measures. STAR 360 is a progress monitoring assessment for both reading and math that allows teachers to adjust their instruction for each student. Lexia is a reading support, added this year, that enhances each student's progress as it is individualized to their specific reading level. Mrs. Amanda Eddy, BVS Special Educator/Interventionist/Lead Teacher, and I meet weekly to review student data to ensure that both teachers and students have what they need to meet academic goals. Our school-wide goal is to provide each student with the most appropriate instruction based on their needs.

Project-based learning is back at BVS and our first of 3 STEAM weeks will see the students making pompom catapults.

Benson Village School continues to award both students and staff with PAWs certificates for demonstrating the positive character traits associated with our district-wide PBIS (<u>https://www.pbis.org/</u>). To date, 257 certificates have been written for students and staff.

The Benson Family Thanksgiving Meal will take place on Tuesday, November 21st with information going out to families soon, so please check student folders and our Facebook page.

The weekly Friday Packet will continue to go out with information on current and upcoming events.

The Reading Group will meet at the library on **Wednesday, November 15, 2023** to discuss *The Most Costly Journey*, the Vermont Reads selection for 2022-23. This non-fiction comics anthology presents stories of survival and healing told by Latin American migrant farmworkers in Vermont, and drawn by New England cartoonists. This collected edition brings the lives and voices—as well as the challenges and hardships—of these workers to an English-language audience, granting insight into the experiences and lives of the people vital to producing the food we eat.

The Reading Group will meet at the library on **Wednesday**, **December 20**, **2023** to discuss *The Christmas Quilt & The New Year's Quilt* by Jennifer Chiaverini. These are 2 heartwarming novels filled with the memories and traditions of Elm Creek Manor's indomitable master quilter, Sylvia Bergstrom Compson. Infused with wisdom and rich with the flavors of the holidays, they are timeless tales that Elm Creek Quilts devotees are sure to cherish. As Sylvia has discovered, love can enter our lives at any age. Yet before she can truly delight in her present happiness, she must face the sorrow hidden in her past—her own role in the tragic circumstances that left her estranged from her sister, Claudia, until it was too late to make amends.

## **BENSON VILLAGE STORE UPDATE**

- The group of fifteen energetic community members met with Ben Doyle from the Preservation Trust of Vermont (PTV) and kicked off a campaign to begin the rebuilding of the Benson Village Store.
- A partnership has been established and we are now registered with the State of Vermont as an
  official non-profit organization and we are currently awaiting our 501(c)3 status. A local lawyer
  has been retained to assist in this process.
- Two members have attended conferences where PTV has shared valuable information from other community sponsored enterprises.
- Four community members attended a day-long visit to four general stores in Vermont that have worked with Preservation Trust of Vermont in order to keep their stores prosperous in their small towns. They shared the process and success of working together with PTV.
- The feedback and support from multiple agencies around the state has given us incredible support and positive feedback that encourages us to continue with our goal. We have our work cut out for us, but we know we can do it with us all working together.

We will keep you up to date as we move along.....

### **INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR TOWN OFFICE?**

Town Meeting and Presidential Primary 2024 will take place on Tuesday, March 5<sup>th</sup>. If you've been thinking about running for a town office, nominating petitions must be filed with the Town Clerk by 5:00 pm on Monday, January 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Town positions to be filled in 2024:

Thursday, January 18<sup>th</sup> is the last day for voters to file a petition with the town clerk to have an article appear on the ballot for Town Meeting. Petition must contain signatures from at least 5% of registered voters in the municipality.

#### TOWN OF BENSON JOB OPPORTUNITY

Benson is seeking a lister to fill the remaining 1 ½ years of a 3-year term – with the option of running again at the end of this term. Flexible hours, now averaging 10 hours per week but with the option of additional hours as arranged; all work is here in Benson. The position has potential for more responsibility at the local level, or advancement to the district or state level. Pay scale at this time is \$14.70/hour, subject to change by the Select Board. Must be a Benson resident.

The most important qualification is an interest in Benson and the fair and equitable maintenance of the Grand List – which is the basis of the tax rate set by the Select Board. For the new lister this means learning about appraisal methods and property assessment administration in Vermont, shared detailed records work, interaction with Benson townspeople, and working collaboratively with others.

No experience is required, but some knowledge of the real estate field is a plus. New lister training is on-the-job in Benson together with compensated continuing education at free state-sponsored classes, leading to the title of Vermont Master Property Appraiser.

The new lister is supported not only by the other two Benson listers, but by district and state advisors, by the Vermont Assessors and Listers Association, and by other listers throughout the State.
