## **BENSON READING GROUP**

For our May meeting, The Reading Group will join with the Orwell Reading Group on Thursday, May 30, 2024 at 6 p.m. We will be discussing the Vermont Reads 2023 book selection <u>Last Night at the Telegraph Club</u> by Malinda Lo. Teenager Lily Hu lives in San Francisco's Chinatown in the 1950s and has a passion for rockets and space exploration. She and her new friend Kathleen sneak out at night to the Telegraph Club, which hosts performances by Tommy Andrews, a woman who dresses and performs in a traditionally masculine style. Kath and Lily's interest in each other continues to grow despite the very real danger faced by two girls falling in love in 1954.

The Reading Group will meet at the library on Wednesday, June 19, 2024 at 4 p.m. to discuss <u>Finding Dorothy</u> by Elizabeth Letts. Maud Gage Baum, widow of the author of the book *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz*, met Judy Garland on the set of *The Wizard of Oz* in 1939. Maud immediately connected to Judy--especially when Maud heard her sing "Over the Rainbow". This wonderfully evocative two-stranded story recreates Maud's youth as the rebellious daughter of a leading suffragette, and the prairie years of Maud and Frank's early days when they lived among the people--especially young Dorothy--who would inspire Frank's masterpiece. Woven into this past story is one set in 1939, describing the high-pressured days on *The Wizard of Oz* film set where Judy is being badgered by the director, producer, and her ambitious stage mother. As Maud had promised to protect the original Dorothy back in Aberdeen, she now takes on the job of protecting young Judy.

Copies of the books are available in the library. You are welcome to join us for an interesting discussion.

## Town Office Notes

- Are you the owner of one of Benson's nearly 300 dogs? Dog tags for 2024 (Yellow this year!) have arrived at the town office. All dogs that are six months of age or older must be licensed on or before April 1<sup>st</sup>. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required for registration. Late fee costs are \$11.00 for spayed or neutered animals and \$17.00 for all others. The first time a dog is registered in Benson a spay/neuter certificate must be shown in order to receive the lower rate. Not sure if your pet needs a shot this year? Call the office to see what we have on file or to notify us that you no longer own a dog.
- Your current transfer station permit expired on March 31<sup>st</sup>. New permits are now available and may be purchased from the Town Office for \$35.00 (no increase from last year). Both dog licenses and transfer station permits can be handled by mail and/or using the secure drop box. Just give me a call for the details.
- Sewer Bills Due June 15<sup>th</sup>: The second payment on Benson 2023-2024 sewer bill will be due on Monday June 17th. There is no grace period---all payments not made at the Town Office or postmarked by that date incur a one-time penalty of 8% and immediately accruing interest charges at the rate of 1% for the first three months and 1 ½% per month thereafter. If the payment is not made by June 17<sup>th</sup> you will owe an additional 9% interest and penalty.
- Reminder: There is now a secure drop box located at the southwest corner of the Town Office building where tax payments may be left at any time.


