Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

The reading group will meet at the library on **Wednesday, October 15, 2025** at 4 p.m. to discuss *Home Before Dark* by Riley Sager. Twenty-five years ago, Maggie Holt and her parents moved into Baneberry Hall, a rambling Victorian estate in the Vermont woods. Three weeks later they fled in the dead of night, an ordeal her father recounted in a memoir called House of Horrors. A haunted house story...with a twist.

We are very proud to share the appointment of our new director, Jasmin Durkee of Fort Ann, New York. Jasmin has acted as the assistant director all summer and is excited to take over the helm of Slate Valley Cares. She has experience in the food service industry and is so creative and energetic that we are really looking forward to an exciting fall season. Stop in and welcome Jasmin, you will recognize her by her infectious smile!

Unfortunately, due to circumstances beyond our control, we have had to cancel this year's Fall Festival. This is very sad for us, as it would have been our 5th year having the festival in Benson. The festival was our major fund raising event, so this is a real setback for us. We are currently working on some other options for fundraising, so stay tuned. As you can imagine with the current changes in grant funding throughout our country, monies for food shelves have been greatly cut. Yet, we are finding the need of people greater than ever with the ever increasing costs at the grocery store.

We are currently open Tuesday and Thursday from 9-2 and Wednesdays from 9-3:30. Our Thrift Store is open at the same hours. We are currently accepting donations to the thrift store, as all money goes to help purchase food items. We are located at 49 Main Street, Fair Haven, right next to the laundromat.
