BENSON READING GROUP

The reading group will meet at the library on September 16 at 4 p.m. to discuss ***Behold the Dreamers*** by Imbolo Mbue. In the fall of 2007, Jende Jonga, a Cameroonian immigrant living in Harlem, lands a job as a chauffeur for Clark Edwards, a senior executive at Lehman Brothers. Jende's wife Neni is hired as household help. But Jende and Neni begin to witness infidelities, skirmishes, and family secrets. Then, with the 2008 collapse of Lehman Brothers, a tragedy changes all four lives forever, and the Jongas must decide whether to continue fighting to stay in a recession-ravaged America or give up and return home to Cameroon.

The reading group will meet at the library on October 21 at 4 p.m. to discuss ***Brave New World*** by Aldous Huxley. A towering classic of dystopian satire, this book is a brilliant and terrifying vision of a soulless society—and of one man who discovers the human costs of mindless conformity. Hundreds of years in the future, the World Controllers have created an ideal civilization. Only Bernard Marx is discontented.

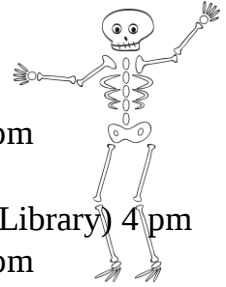

Due to the MERP Grant Energy Improvements, the Benson Museum will be closed temporarily, for packing up and storing items until the energy improvements are completed at the town office. The municipal rate was calculated and set by the Selectboard on August 03, 2026 and raises the funds to cover the amounts voted at the Town Meeting for the general expenses of the town, the Highway budget, and all appropriations such as those for the Library, Fire Department and the maintenance of the cemeteries. This rate is the same for both Homestead and Non-Homestead properties.

The local agreement rate compensates the state education fund for the \$20,000 reduction in assessment (not taxes) that Benson has voted to give its disabled veterans. This is also the same for all properties.

Education rates are set by the State, taking into account local per pupil spending plus their analysis of how close to fair market value our Grand List is (Benson's common level of appraisal). A property which the owner has declared to be their principal residence with the Vermont Department of Taxes pays the Homestead rate. All other properties pay the Non-Homestead Rate.

*A tax rate is the amount of property tax owed per \$100 of property valuation. At this year's rates, a property assessed at \$100,000 would owe \$2,823.70 at the homestead rate and \$2,965.40 at the non-homestead rate.

TAX BILLS WERE MAILED BY THE FIRST FULL WEEK IN AUGUST AND THE FIRST PAYMENT WILL BE DUE SEPTEMBER 15th.

PROPERTY TAXES DUE September 15th

The first payment of 2026-2027 property taxes is due on Tuesday, September 15th.

There is no grace period. In order to count as timely (and avoid interest charges) payments must be received at the Town Office by the close of business on the due date (5pm) or carry a legible USPS postmark of September 15th or earlier. If you handle your bill paying electronically you should be aware that the envelopes used generally do not carry a postmark. They cannot be considered on time—regardless of the date on the check—unless they arrive at the Town Office on or before the due date. You're welcome to call the Office at 802-537-2611 or 802-456-4094 (extension 1) to make sure your payment arrived safely, or include a SASE and we'll send you a receipt.

Extended hours on Tuesday, September 15th will be 9am-5pm. If you'd like to pay in person but aren't comfortable coming in to the Town Office I'd be happy to meet you at your car. There is a handicapped entrance at the rear of the building. Extended hours for the 2nd Payment due March 15, 2027 will be Saturday March 13, 2027 8am-1pm. Monday March 15, 2027 we will be open 9am-5pm.

PLEASE NOTE: There is now a secure drop box located at the southwest corner of the Town Office building where tax payments may be left at any time.



Questions about the Benson Property Reappraisal?

A few clarifying points that may help:

When will the appraisers come to my house?

- We send out a postcard two weeks before the expected visit.

Why didn't the appraisers come when they said they would be here?

- Either of the two appraisers in Benson may cancel because of rain, or take longer on a previous assignment than was anticipated, or have traveling problems including car trouble, or some other emergency.

What can I do if they came and I wasn't here and I want an interior inspection?

- Call Gina at the office and an inspection will be arranged.

What if I don't have a way to go online and see my appraisal information?

- Gina can help with that. Call her at the office.

Why is a lister sometimes with the appraiser?

- After the reappraisal, for the next several years, the listers will be responsible for keeping the new properties and the changes in properties up-to-date and assessed fairly with the rest of the town. Accompanying the appraiser is the best way to learn how the appraisal is being conducted and keep everything as equitable as possible for as long as possible.

Why can't we see what our appraisal is?

- The inspection part of the reappraisal comes first, then the appraisers use their knowledge and experience and information to assign values to each property.

What can I do if I disagree with what they said, or how much my property is in for?

- CALL THE LISTERS OFFICE. This is very important. There will be a time when you can make an appointment with either the listers and/or the listers and the appraiser. There are deadlines for opportunities for discussion and changes, so stay in touch.

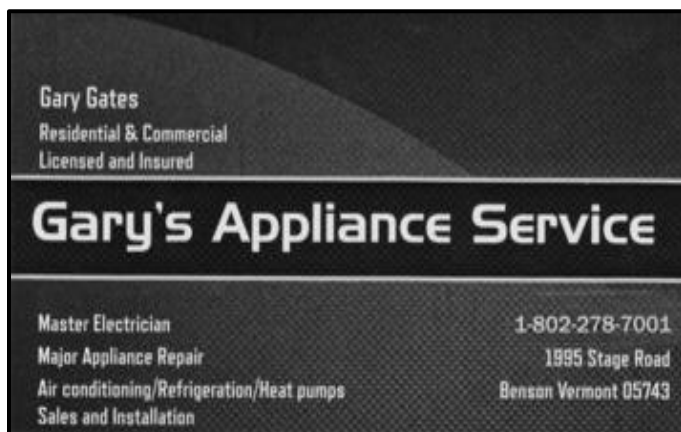
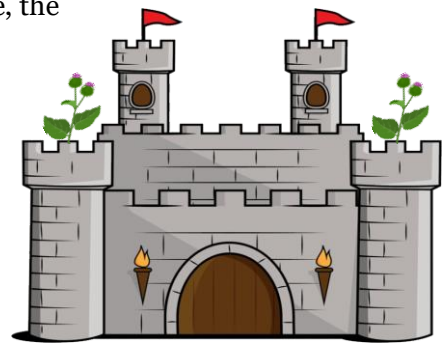

There were 65 Democratic ballots, 73 Republican ballots, and no Progressive ballot cast. WHAT'S NEXT?

Ballots for the General Election in November will be mailed to all active registered voters directly from the State beginning around September 21st. Look for details about options for returning your ballot in the November Benson Bulletin. The polls will also be open from 10 am to 7 pm on Election Day if you choose to vote in person. **In addition to voting on State and National offices, Benson will also choose its five Justices of the Peace on November 8th.**

Candidates are Lynn Bowen, John Hill, Ed Peltier, Eric Shaw and Jean-Sebastien Valois. Benson's Justices are election officials for the town and serve on the boards that rule on tax appeals and hear requests for abatements. The number of justices in a given town is determined on the basis of population, and all towns elect their justices every two years as a part of the General Election.
